Data Touchpoints

IN ADULT EDUCATION

Orientation & Intake

This is the first opportunity to collect data from students.

4 Separation

This may be the last chance to update data on a student. Use any contact to also verify the student's data.

2 Classroom


Faculty have the benefit of building trust with students; they may have access to important data.

3 Testing

Whether students go to a testing site, use the Assessment Hub, or test in the classroom, this is a good time to review their data.

Just some of the data we collect

- Barriers to Employment
 - Performance adjustment
 - Opportunity for wrap-around services
- Demographic information
- Employment information
 - Never mark a student who entered as unemployed as employed if they get a job; that's what the data matching it for
- Goals
- Co-enrollments
 - Participation in other WIOA Title services
 - Social Security Number
 - Required for data matching
