INDEX OF NEED

MEANING AND CONSTRUCTION

- DEFINITION: PROBABILITY THAT AN ILLINOIS RESIDENT IN NEED OF ONE OR MORE ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAMS LIVES IN THAT COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT (AREA PLANNING COUNCIL – APC)
 - INDEX NUMBER IS RELATIVE TO STATE POPULATION - BASED ON STATISTICS IN A GIVEN YEAR
 - ADULTS DEFINED AS POPULATION 16 YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER
 - POPULATION STATISTICS IN TABLES 1 AND 2 ARE DERIVED FROM BUREAU OF CENSUS POPULATION RELEASES AS OF JULY 1ST OF THE PREVIOUS CALENDAR YEAR (FOR THE 2025 TABLES, THAT DATE IS JULY 1, 2024)

INDEX OF NEED

MEANING AND CONSTRUCTION (con.)

- **COMPONENTS (Four)**

- **ADULT EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT**
 - <9 GRADES OF FORMAL EDUCATION (NUMBER WEIGHTED BY 1.5)
 - 9<HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA (WEIGHT: 1.0)
- **ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL)**
 - HOUSEHOLD RESIDENTS SPEAK ENGLISH “WELL” (CENSUS CATEGORIES – Very Well and Well) - Weight: 1.0
 - HOUSEHOLD RESIDENTS DO NOT SPEAK ENGLISH WELL (CENSUS CATEGORIES – Not Well or Not at All) – Weight: 1.5
- **ADULTS LIVING IN HOUSEHOLDS WITH ANNUAL INCOMES LESS THAN FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL (WEIGHT: 1.0)**
- **AVERAGE MONTHLY NUMBER UNEMPLOYED IN PREVIOUS CALENDAR YEAR (WEIGHT: 1.0)**

INDEX OF NEED CONSTRUCTION (con.)

- HYPOTHETICAL EXAMPLE

- STATE – POPULATION: 10,000,000

- INDEX OF NEED POPULATION

- EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT (EDATT):

- <9 GRADES OF FORMAL EDUCATION: 250,000 X 1.5 = 375,000

- 9<HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA (HSD): 750,000 X 1.0 = 750,000

- BASE NO. FOR INDEX CALCULATIONS = 1,125,000

- ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL):

- DOES NOT SPEAK ENGLISH WELL (DNSEW): 50,000 X 1.5 = 75,000

- SPEAK ENGLISH WELL (SEW): 450,000 X 1.0 = 450,000

- BASE NO. = 525,000

- ADULT POPULATION IN POVERTY (POV): 1,000,000 X 1.0 = 1,000,000 (BASE NO.)

- UNEMPLOYED (UNEMP): 250,000 X 1.0 = 250,000 (BASE NO.)

INDEX OF NEED CONSTRUCTION (con.)

- COUNTY A:

- EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT:

- <9 GRADES: 2500 X 1.5 = 3750 (INDEX NO.)
 - 9<HSD: 6000 X 1.0 = 6000 (INDEX NO.)
 - EDATT NO. = 9750 (INDEX COMPONENT)

- ESL:

- DNSEW: 400 x 1.5 = 600
 - SEW: 4000 X 1.0 = 4000
 - ESL NO. = 4600 (INDEX COMPONENT)

- POV: 7500 X 1.0 = 7500 (INDEX COMPONENT)

- UNEMP: 2500 X 1.0 = 2500 (INDEX COMPONENT)

INDEX OF NEED CONSTRUCTION (con.)

- CALCULATION OF INDEX OF NEED FOR COUNTY A:
 - EDATT: COUNTY A INDEX COMP/STATE BASE NO. X EDATTAIN WEIGHT (0.45)
 - $9750/1125000 = 0.0087 \times 0.45 = 0.0039$ (INDEX OF NEED COMP)
 - ESL: $4600/525000 = 0.0088 \times 0.25$ (ESL INDEX WEIGHT) = 0.0022
 - POV: $7500/1000000 = 0.0075 \times 0.25$ (POV INDEX WEIGHT) = 0.001875
 - UNEMP: $2500/250000 = 0.01 \times 0.05$ (UNEMP INDEX WEIGHT) = 0.0005
- Note that weights sum to 1.0 (0.45 + 0.25 + 0.25 + 0.05)
- INDEX OF NEED FOR COUNTY A = SUM (EDATT, ESL,POV,UNEMP)
 - INDEX NUMBER = $0.0039+0.0022+0.001875 +0.0005 = 0.008475$

- COUNTY A SUBINDEX NO: 0.008475
- COUNTY B SUBINDEX NO: 0.005125
- COUNTY C SUBINDEX NO: 0.001350
- COUNTY D SUBINDEX NO: 0.010205
- COUNTY E SUBINDEX NO: 0.000500

- INDEX OF NEED FOR APC NO. 1: 0.025655

 - ACCOMPANIED BY A COVER LETTER THAT DESCRIBES THE CONTENTS OF EACH TABLE AND ANY CHANGES THAT HAVE BEEN MADE SINCE THE PREVIOUS SET OF TABLES

INDEX OF NEED TABLES

- TABLE 1 – ESTIMATED TOTAL POPULATION FOR APC BY GENDER AND BUREAU OF THE CENSUS DEMOGRAPHIC CATEGORIES (WHITE, BLACK, NATIVE AMERICAN, ASIAN, PACIFIC ISLANDER, OTHER – nec, TWO OR MORE ETHNICITIES, HISPANIC) as of July 1st of previous year
 - Total Population = Sum of White, Black, Native American, Asian, Pacific Islander, Other, and Two or More
 - HISPANIC IS A CULTURAL, NOT A DEMOGRAPHIC, CATEGORY
- DATA SOURCES (DATA.CENSUS.GOV):
 - American Community Survey (ACS) Tables: SERIES B01001, B02001, B03001
 - Bureau of the Census Population Estimates

 - AMERICAN COMMUNITY SURVEY (ACS) SERIES BEGINNING WITH B01001, B02001, B03001
 - POPULATION ESTIMATES

- TABLE 3: POPULATIONS OF INTEREST
 - NUMBER INCARCERATED IN PRISONS UNDER DIRECTION OF DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS (IDOC)
 - ANNUAL REPORT FROM IDOC DIRECTOR RELEASED IN JULY
 - INDIVIDUALS WITH ONE OR MORE DISABILITIES THAT AFFECT ATTACHMENT TO LABOR FORCE
 - ACS TABLE B18101
 - INDIVIDUALS WITH A COGNITIVE DISORDER THAT AFFECTS ATTACHMENT TO LABOR FORCE
 - ACS TABLE B18104
 - TOTAL POPULATION ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ONE OR MORE PROGRAMS ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES
 - MAY DATA PROVIDED BY DHS RESEARCH STAFF
 - ADULT POPULATION ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE SERVICES FROM DHS
 - AGE 16 AND OVER FROM MAY DATA PROVIDED BY DHS

 - SOURCE: ACS B15001 AND RELATED TABLES FROM DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION
- IMMIGRANTS LIVING IN THE US SINCE 2010 (IMM)
 - SOURCE: ACS B05005
- SUM OF <9, 9<HSD, IMM

- **ENTRIES**

- TOTAL NUMBER AGE 5 AND OLDER LIVING IN HOUSEHOLDS IN WHICH A LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH IS SPOKEN

- NUMBER THAT SPEAK SPANISH (SPAN)
- NUMBER OF THAT SPEAK AN INDOEUROPEAN LANGUAGE OTHER THAN SPANISH (IE)
- NUMBER THAT SPEAK AN ASIAN LANGUAGE (ASIAN)
- NUMBER THAT SPEAK A LANGUAGE NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED (NEC)

- TOTAL NUMBER OF ADULTS AGE 16 AND OVER IN ESL HOUSEHOLDS (ADULT)

- NUMBER OF ADULTS THAT DO NOT SPEAK ENGLISH WELL (DNSEW = NOT WELL + NOT)

 - AVERAGE MONTHLY UNEMPLOYMENT (UNEMP)
 - AVERAGE MONTHLY LABOR FORCE
 - DATA SOURCE: ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF EMPLOYMENT SECURITY (IDES)
 - MOST RECENT CALENDAR YEAR
 - LOCAL AREA UNEMPLOYMENT STATISTICS (LAUS)
 - AVERAGE MONTHLY UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

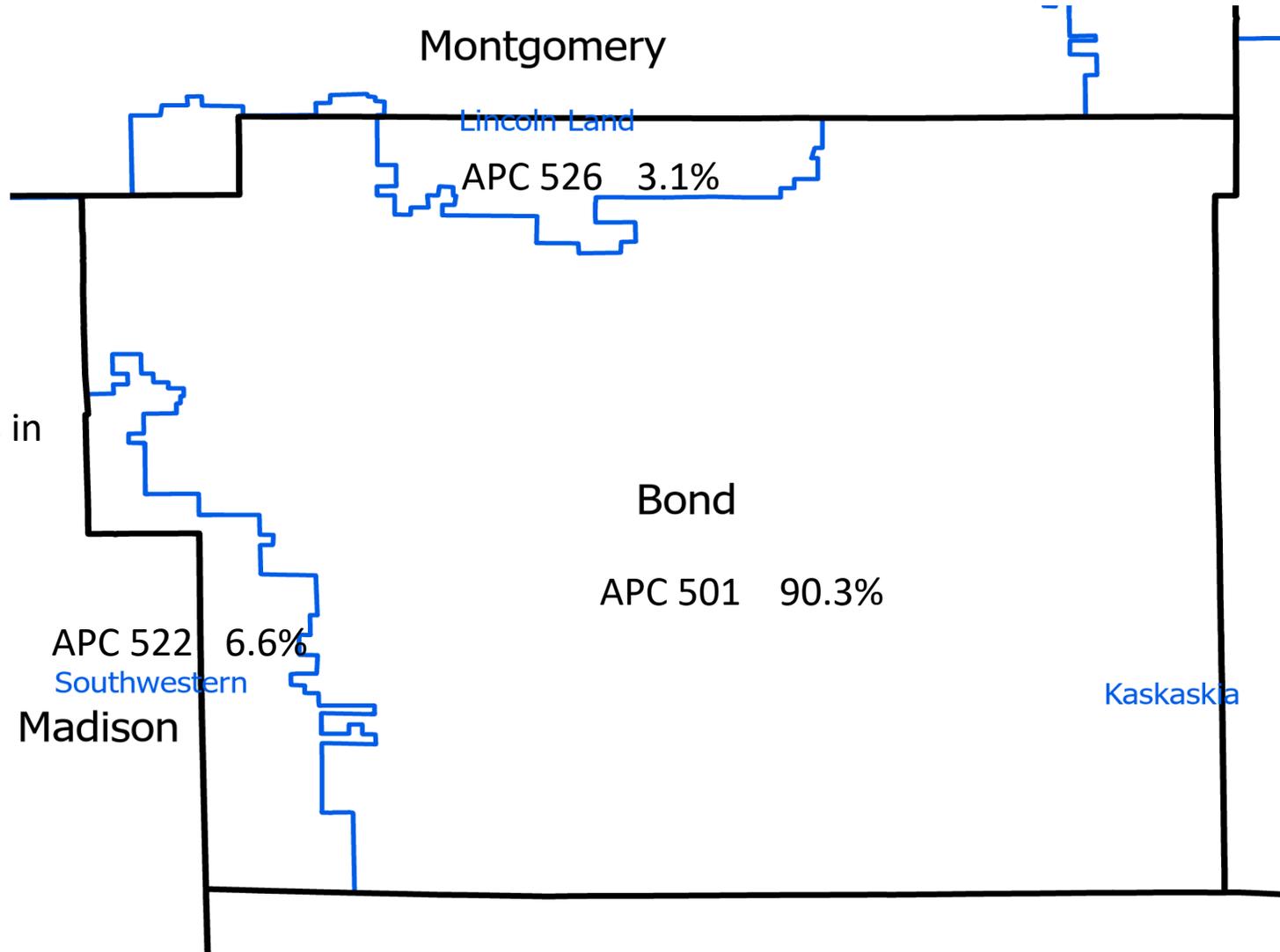

- FROM Table 4: EDATT ($<9 \times 1.5 + 9 < \text{HSD}$) – INDEX COMPONENT WEIGHT: 0.45
- FROM Table 5: ESL ($\text{DNSEW} \times 1.5 + \text{SEW}$) – INDEX COMPONENT WEIGHT: 0.25
- FROM Table 6: POV – INDEX COMPONENT WEIGHT – 0.25
- FROM Table 7: UNEMP – INDEX COMPONENT WEIGHT – 0.05
- INDEX OF NEED (column 1): $0.45 \times \text{EDATT/STATE EDATT BASE} + 0.25 \times \text{ESL/STATE ESL BASE} + 0.25 \times \text{POV/STATE POV BASE} + 0.05 \times \text{UNEMP/STATE UNEMP BASE}$

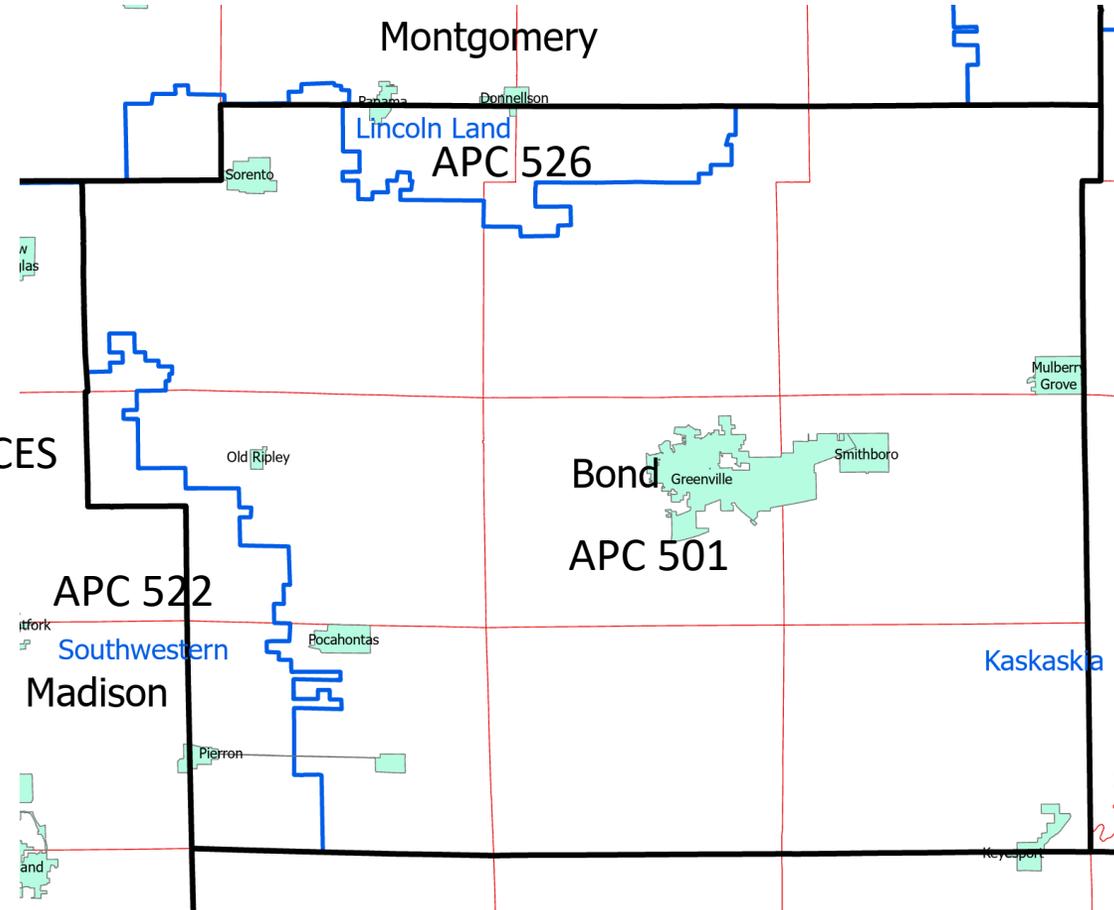

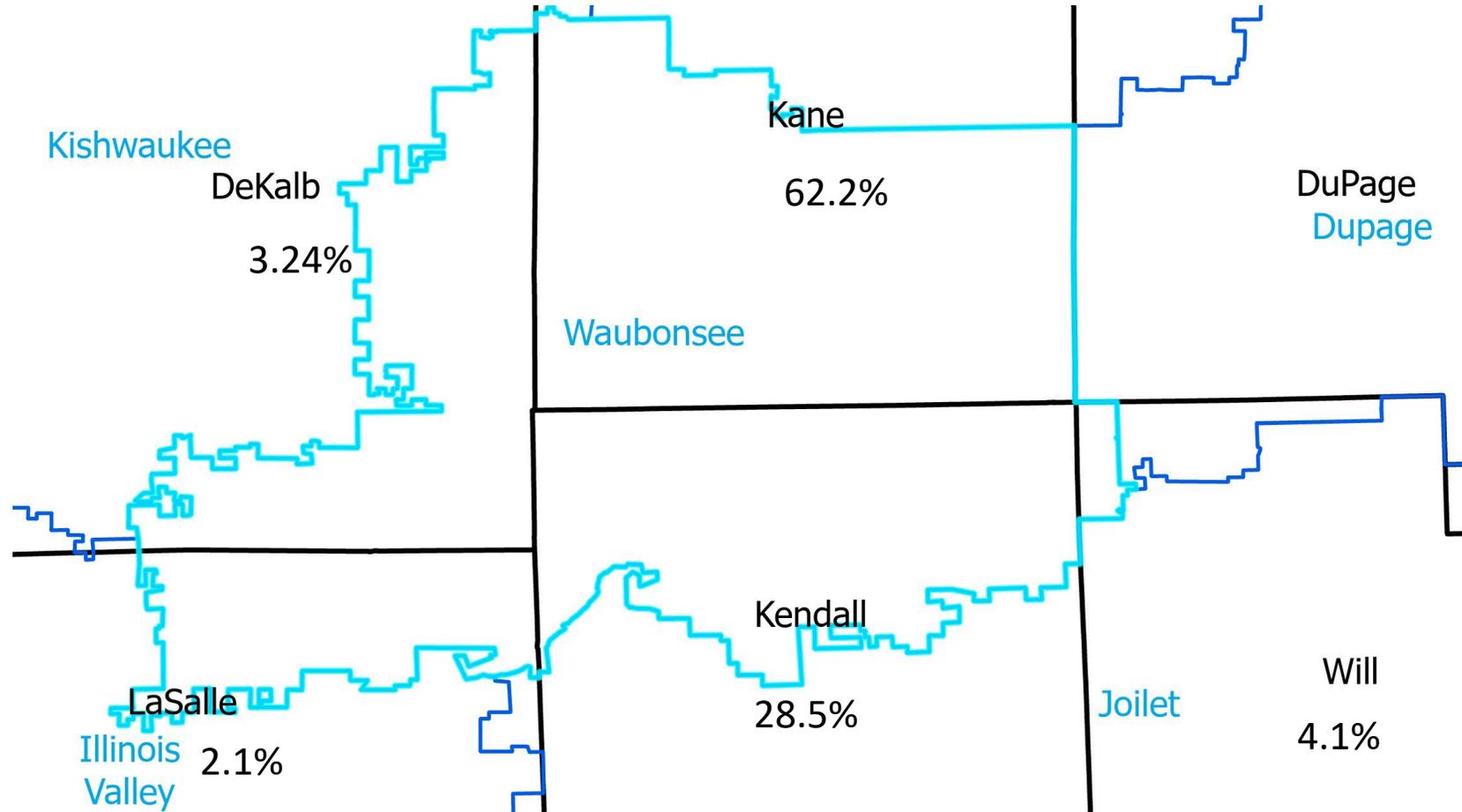

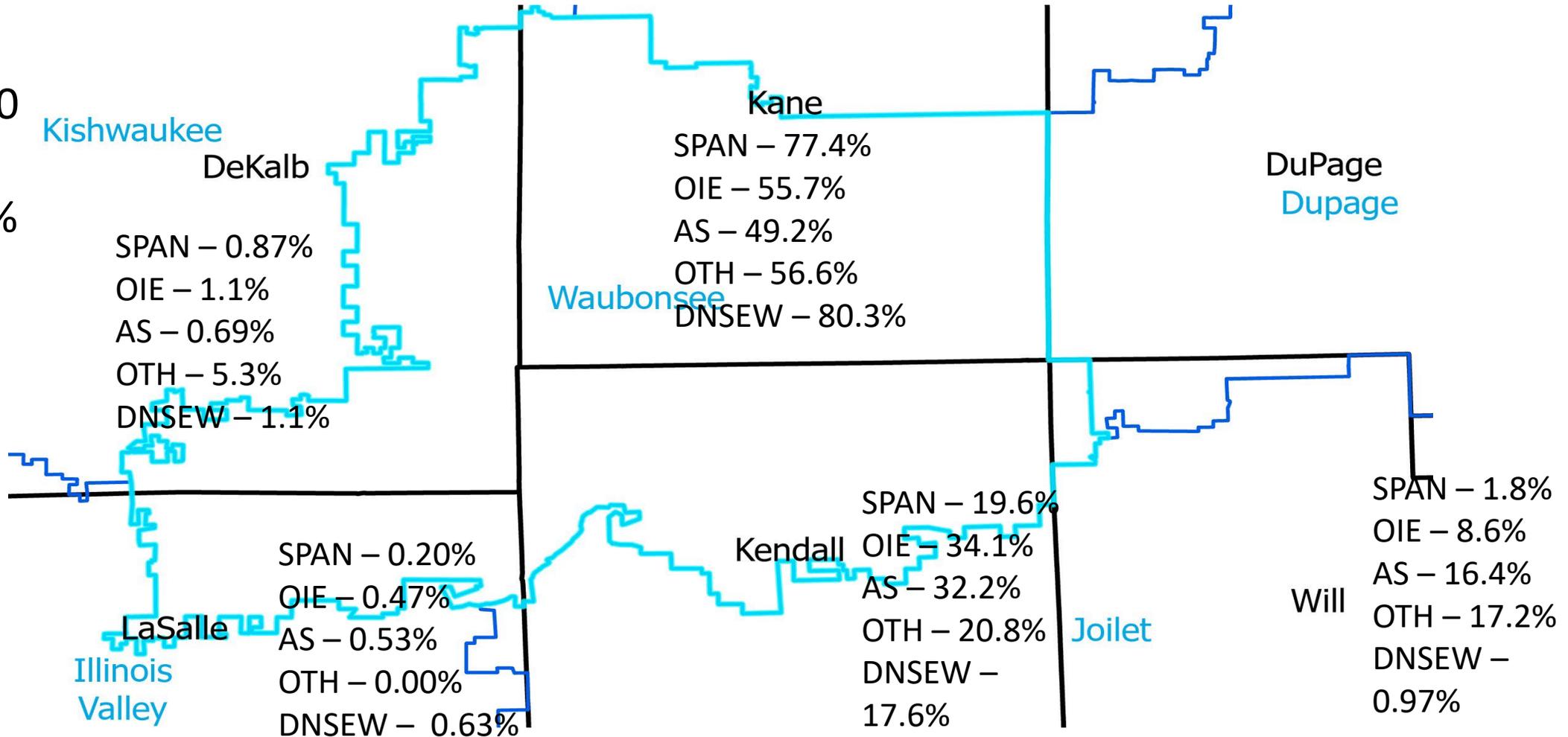
